sign on, some us work, some of us sign on AND work. Some of us squat and some of us pay rent.Most of the BLAGGERS have 9-5 jobs. This makes it difficult to get enough time off to tour as much as we'd like to and when we do any recording,it's got to be late night sessions and weekends. Trying to hold down a full time job and be in a successful full time group is a major headache,the money and we're talking between 10-15 thousand a year will each pay our rent, food, clothes and bills so that we can give all our time to writing songs and! touring. We're not talking about flash Italian suits and K-req BMW's there, but chance for us to work as band properly.

If can't increase public awareness about fascism then it's cos they didn't want to know. We are using the establishment to fight back against the establishment!

Almost every gig we do now is threatened but that's all that's happened. we were ever attacked they'd need a pretty heavy mob 'cos people don't take shit like they used to and we always have good security at gigs. Who knows? We might have to move addresses one day, but somebodies got stand up and be prepared to put their necks on the line. You don't get results unless you try!


